This popular 'bumper sticker' sounds a rallying cry for the season of Epiphany. Beginning on January 6 with the arrival of the wise-men or 'magi' at the manger, the next weeks prior to Lent (March 1) are all about the revealing of Jesus. With his baptism on the first Sunday and climaxing with transfiguration on the last, the identity of the 'Christ' becomes clearer, and his mission of teaching and healing shows itself in specific ways. These reviews of Jesus' life are meant to be an inspiration for the Church to grow in its faith and follow his example. This seems like an excellent way to enter the new year making our religion relevant and practical.

So, how do we accomplish it? It seems that the wise-men had some hope and confidence that their efforts would make a difference. Why would they risk a long, uncomfortable journey to a foreign land following a bright star unless they had some prior knowledge or experience that it would be legitimate? Like so many others effected by the 'good news', we don't know what happened after their encounter, other than returning home, but we would assume that their faith was affirmed and their lives were changed.

I believe we are in a similar circumstance in that we have some hope and confidence that our efforts in seeking Jesus will lead to the same results - our faith will be affirmed and our lives will be changed. As we make the effort to worship God because of our prior knowledge and experience of who God is and what God has done, we are inspired to return to our lives determined to spread the 'good news' that a savior has come to bring healing and hope. We are a people with a purpose, and having received mercy and strength from our learning about Jesus, we are sent to spread the 'good news' through witness and service. Whether witnessing by our worship with the community on Sunday morning or praying at breakfast on Monday morning, whether serving at the food pantry on Saturday or helping a neighbor shovel their driveway on Tuesday, we are seeking the Lord by our thoughts and actions.



As we continue in this 'Epiphany Season', let us make an effort 'to show' the identity of Jesus by the ways we witness and serve each day. May God bless and keep you in the true faith of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord! See you in church. Pastor Larry

Church and other Fund investments performed well in 2016. As year-end investment statements come in, the fund accounts will be reconciled and finalized. Investments are securely held at Vanguard and TD Ameritrade.

### ARE YOU INTERESTED IN JOINING OUR FAMILY AND BECOMING A CHURCH MEMBER?

First Christian Church has 2 categories of members. One is as a full member - those who consider First Christian Church of Freedom their primary church. We also have a second category of people who may belong to another congregation. called 'associate It's membership'. It may be that a person is a lifetime member of a church in another state, and really wants to retain their membership there. Or, it may be, as is the case with me and many others, that for other benefits, one wants to maintain membership in a church of a particular denomination, or where one's family has always been a member, and it is necessary or desirable that one retain membership in a denominational church. In this case, one can become an associate member here and have all the privileges of a full member - vote, pastoral care, involvement in various ministries, serving in leadership, etc.

We want to invite those who are not, to become full or associate members. Being on this 'list' does not make anyone better or more Christian than anyone else, but it does help us get 'a handle' on 'who we are' as a congregation, and maybe how we need to shape our mission and ministries.


### TWO LITTLE BOYS
