"No Cure for Being Human

(And Other Truths I Need to Hear)"

by Kate Bowler

"No Cure for Being Human (And Other Truths I need to Hear)" by Kate Bowler, is the next book the Book Group shall start discussing on *Thursday, May 5th at 9:30 AM*.

Kate Bowler is on the faculty at Duke University in the School of Divinity. At 35 she was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer.

"With dry wit and unflinching honesty, Kate Bowler grapples with her diagnosis, her ambition, and her faith as she tries to come to terms with her limitations in a culture that says anything is possible. She finds that we need one another if we're going to tell the truth: Life is beautiful and terrible, full of hope and despair and everything in between—and there's no cure for being human."

If you have ever cried, "It is not fair," over a tragedy that has happened to you or to a loved one, then this book will help you wrestle with those issues. There are some walls we cannot deny, get over, or get around no matter how we may think we can. How do we approach God and expect God to act? Come and discuss with us. Read the first two chapters for May 5th. The book group meets weekly with probably about 50 pages a week. It will vary depending upon what the group wants to cover.

## **Treasurer Report**

### **Church Financial Activity**

All Church expenses received are paid. As of April16, 2022, Church expenses exceed income by \$10.4k due to continued weak giving. Financial assistance from the Parsonage and Perpetual Funds will offset about half.

The Food Pantry has a net profit of \$ 1k profit through April 1 6, 2022 due to continued strong Individual support.



### **Investments**

For the first quarter 2022, Church investments are down 3% and Food Pantry investments are down2%. By comparison, the S&P 500 stock index was down 5% and the NASDAQ was down 9%. Church and Food Pantry returns are better than the stock indexes as both the Church and Food Pantry investment portfolio are diversified with a strong cash position. The Church pooled investment account is held by discount brokerage custodians Vanguard and TD Ameritrade. The Food Pantry investment account is held by Fidelity with Thrivent as their investment advisor.
